Subject: Photography

 Overview of the year: Students work on their Personal Portfolios until mid-January when they will produce a final piece of work that can take many forms. The Personal Portfolio is worth 60% of the final grade. In February we launch the Externally Set Assignment which is a series of potential starting points that come from our exam board. This finishes in May with a 15-hour timed test held in the art department under exam conditions where the students produce a final piece. This final piece and the supporting sketchbook are worth 40% of the final grade. Assessment objective I Develop ideas through sustained and focused investigations informed by contextual and other sources, demonstrating analytical and critical understanding. Assessment objective 2 Explore and select appropriate resources, media, materials, techniques and processes, reviewing and refining ideas as work develops. Assessment objective 3 Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions, reflecting critically on work and progress. Assessment objective 4 Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and, where appropriate, makes connections between visual and other elements. 	 Ways to consolidate and extend your learning in photography: Continue to visit and record photography exhibitions. Students should always have some form of camera with hem and be ready to record observations and experiences. An iPhone is perfect. Collect visual material from a variety of sources, magazines, papers, books, this source material can be really helpful when students work towards their own visual solutions. Ensure students are on top of the work set, keep a regular eye on Satchel to help support deadlines, and complete work that may need completing form lessons. Encourage your child to do their own research into Photographers or art or film movements. There are some very well-made TV documentaries about Photography on BBC iPlayer, and ensure they discuss these with their teacher as part of their investigation.
