Year 11 and Year 13 Updates

Congratulations to our Year 11 students, who have just completed their Pre-Public Exams (PPEs). Their attitude, commitment, and adherence to expectations have been outstanding, and we are incredibly proud of them. We look forward to sharing their results later this month.

On Friday, our Year 11 students will participate in a Post-16 Taster Day, allowing them to experience a typical day as a sixth former. We wish them the best of luck!

Top Field Restoration Project

We are excited to share plans for the potential restoration of the school's sports field (Top Field) in partnership with Highgate Cricket Club and North London Cricket Club. If this initiative proceeds, it will include two football pitches, a high-quality cricket square, a running track, and a long jump pit. These upgrades would significantly enhance our students' sporting experience. The project is still in the early stages and will be funded by the cricket clubs, who would use the facilities outside of school hours.

However, some local residents have opposed these plans due to the school's intention to fence the area for safeguarding purposes. A 'Town Green Application' has been submitted to Haringey Council to preserve the field as an open public space.

We encourage parents and carers to share their views to support the school being able to progress further towards providing excellent facilities for your children. Any person wishing to object to the registration of the land as a town or village green should send a statement of the facts on which the objection is based to planning.policy@haringey.gov.uk on or before 6 February 2025.

Toilet Upgrades

The improvements have had a significant impact on the student experience. We now aim to upgrade the toilets in the Windrush Building, though this will likely require fundraising efforts as further council funding is not anticipated.
