YEAR 13 HISTORY TRIP TO AUSCHWITZ

Thirty History A Level students went to Poland to visit the Auschwitz memorial and other Holocaust-related sites in Krakov.

In an emotionally and physically exhausting three days, the students visited the concentration and extermination camp at Auschwitz/Birkenau and the Galician Jewish Museum.

At the camps, we had the poignant experience of witnessing the sites where 1.3 million were murdered in less than four years. Doubtless, we will all carry these thought-provoking memories for life.



At the museum, we had the privilege of hearing a powerful talk by Holocaust survivor Monika Goldwasser. The talk concluded with two students, Zelal Sigincli and Ayla Jacobsberg, doing very moving readings of some of Marsha's writings.

We also did a walking tour of Kazimierez, the city's old Jewish quarter, to get a flavour of what was once a thriving Jewish community before the Nazi occupation.

Thanks go to Ms Georgiades and Mr Padfield for all their hard work and brilliant organisation.

Well done to their students for their maturity in dealing not only with flight delays and diversions and terrible weather, but also with a challenging but extremely worthwhile trip.

Year 13 PPEs start on 20th January and run for two weeks. Year 12 PPE are the first two weeks back after the Easter break. Access arrangements have been reviewed and training provided on how to use these effectively. Exam skills sessions will be focusing on Study Skills, revision and target setting. The Spring Term is short and busy - potentially one of the most important in terms of learning and we look forward to challenging our students to achieve their absolute best.
