


Transition and Choices (or Not!)

- We do not offer the option of choosing a friend you wish to be with in your tutor group
- Groups are carefully organised based on a range of factors and information from primary schools – our aim is to ensure groups are diverse and balanced
- We view mixing friendship groups as an important aspect of the primary/secondary transition
- Students are not taught in their tutor groups for any lessons they will be taught in consistent teaching groups in all subjects except maths where they are setted
- Whether a student studies French or Spanish is dependent on which side of the year their teaching group is in – not their form group



The Power of 3 – Making Our Children Successful

- Regular and effective communication between the school and home
- Teachers and students form working relationships based on mutual respect & 4Cs
- Parents actively supporting their children at home





Assessment, feedback and reporting at KS3

- Because students take a range of different subjects with different teachers, and these teachers often teach hundreds of students, this will be different in secondary school.
- Staff will still assess students work regularly, and expect students to respond to these comments. You should be able to see evidence of this when they bring their books home.



Assessment, feedback and reporting at KS3

Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 3 Transition

- The transition from Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 3 is a significant one:
 - A smaller school setting to usually a much larger one
 - A change in teaching methods, routines and expectations
 - A broader and often more challenging curriculum
- Opportunities arise to develop:
 - higher-level thinking skills
 - independent learning skills
 - increased self-responsibility
 - new and existing friendships





What does transition look like at Highgate Wood School?

- We have a transition programme that helps our students adjust to the changes, get to know their new school environment, and support their academic and social development. This includes:
 - Year 7 Team Building Day
 - Year 7 Halloween Disco
 - Year 8 Buddies
 - Transitions Mentoring groups
 - Learning Support and the Maya Angelou Centre
 - Life Skills and tutor time

The Learning Support Department

- Primary schools, as well as parents via Applicaa, have shared information regarding our students with Special Educational Needs
- The Learning Support Department identify students' need based on teacher feedback, progress and attainment
- Decisions for intervention are primarily based on our knowledge of the students and professional judgement
- Access Arrangements are provisional in Key Stage 3 and we aim to encourage independence throughout the Key Stage



The Learning Support Department

- Any SEND queries must be submitted using the proforma on the website
- Where needs occur or we are concerned about progress, we consider interventions which are within our universal provision offer
- 1:1 in-class support in each lesson is not typically a model which promotes independence
- Break and lunch and homework club accessible to all
- Teachers are trained extensively throughout the year on individual needs and wider neurodiversity



How can my child prepare for transition?



- Familiarise themselves with the journey to and from school. Remember that they will be using the entrance on Park Road. We often call this the 'Back Gate'
- Ensure they have the correct school uniform, PE kit and equipment.
 Tutors will cover this in more detail this evening in the tutor session and a full uniform list will be placed onto the school website tomorrow morning (along with all the resources from today)
- Read regularly. Reading is part of our school day at HWS and we really value its importance
- Establish a clear sleep routine (especially towards the end of summer) so that they are ready for the September alarm
- Talk about any concerns or worries they might have



What will happen in September?

 - Arrive at school by 09.30am in full school uniform at the Back Gate on Park Road
 - Leave school at 1.00pm via the Back Gate

Mobile Phones and Social Media

- Mobile phones are not allowed to be seen or heard at Highgate Wood School
- We do not recommend students becoming part of teaching group WhatsApp groups, or WhatsApp groups with students they do not know. We recommend that students only communicate with 1:1 via mobile phone messaging
- No Year 7 Highgate Wood School student should have TikTok, Snapchat or Instagram. The minimum age for these platforms is 13 years old.
