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Dear Year 11 Parent,

I am writing to give some further information about the evolving situation with Year 11 this year in order to keep you informed, I am sorry this letter is so long but there is a lot of issues as you can imagine.

Firstly, once again, I would like to extend my gratitude to parents and students. Our Year 11 have been wonderful both in the preparation and during their exams. It has been such a pleasure working with them this year, their dedication and compassion is truly inspirational.

Year 11 are back in school as normal on Monday. We have been very understanding of uniform issues such as shoes and hoodies / coats in the exam hall in the last few days due to it being a bit cold. Please ensure uniform is back to normal on Monday as I don't want year 11 to have a negative experience in what should be a week of some work but much celebration and relief. Re-sit exams will still go on during the week as we want year 11 to have a proper rest over Christmas. If they have an exam they go to their lesson after that and leave at the normal time of 3pm. Some resits for those still self isolating or ill will occur in the first week back and if your child has missed any exams then they should be prepared to sit these from the first day back.

Although lessons may be rather less intense in the final week of term I would still expect much useful work to be done. Exam papers might be looked at in some lessons to start to provide some feedback. Any information that might lead to a grade is embargoed as a school until the mock results afternoon on Tuesday January 19th 2021, the same day as the Year 11 Parents' Evening (online). We find that the communal sharing of the joys and sometimes disappointments, provides a real sense of community and focus and marks the start of the next stage of Year 11. We will be using the predictions to put in place intervention for groups and individuals in order to maximise the outcomes for year 11 whilst also minimise the stress levels as much as possible.

In preparation for sixth form Ms Pinnick will be organising a sixth form taster day on Friday 22nd January 2021 which students find very enjoyable and useful. On that day they will be treated as sixth form students and take part in sixth form lessons for subjects of their choosing. A small group of students will take part in experiencing BTEC style lessons if this is more appropriate for them. More information will come from the sixth form team next term.
